When you haven't experienced a cyber attack, it can be easy to let good habits slip.


See how simple actions today can keep you safe tomorrow, next month, and beyond.



The reality today

Cyber threats are becoming more sophisticated every day.

Police-reported cyber-related fraud nearly doubled between 2019 and 2024, from **22.746 incidents to 46.301.**¹



Almost one in six Canadians (more than six million!) report being a victim of a social media account hack.²

65% of online Canadians are worried about Al-related cybercrime.²





Where to start

Cyber security doesn't have to be complicated. Here's what you could do today:



If you're in the 70% of Canadians

who don't have a password manager²

You could... Find out how to choose the right password manager.



Quick tip:

Choose one with strong encryption and built-in autofill.



who don't have automatic updates enabled²

You could... Learn how to update software.

Quick tip:

Go to Settings > Software Update and turn on auto-updates.

The changing landscape

Individuals and businesses alike are figuring out how to use Artificial Intelligence (AI) to make their jobs easier, while cyber criminals also use AI to create more convincing phishing scams or automated cyber attacks. Many Canadians aren't sure how to protect themselves online.

40% of online Canadians

were not confident in their ability to identify content that is generated by AL.²











If you're in the 27% of Canadians

who aren't very confident they can spot a phishing scam²

You could... Learn about the 7 red flags of phishing.

Quick tip:

Look for typos in the sender, ignore urgent threats, and hover over links first.

If you're in the 52% of Canadians

who don't often back up their devices³

You could... Learn how to back up your data.

Quick tip:

Back up weekly to a cloud or external drive.



If you're in the 10% of Canadians

who haven't heard of Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)3

You could... Learn more about MFA.

Quick tip:

Turn on MFA in your account's security settings using SMS or an authenticator app



Why your future self will thank you

Cyber attacks can happen when you least expect it. Waiting too long before taking action could leave you vulnerable.

One thing the data isn't showing? There's no report that indicates Canadians regret getting cyber safe!
